## Missouri Chapter Wins Second Sweepstakes Award in Four Years


For the second time in four years, the Missouri Chapter of Delta Upsilon received the Sweepstakes Award at the International Leadership Conference, held July 25-28 in Albany, New York. The award is given to the top overall DU chapter in the U.S. and Canada.

There are currently 82 active DU chapters in North America, with more than 3,000 undergraduate members. Seven finalists are nominated for the Sweepstakes Award each year.

This was the eighth time in the last nine years that our chapter was a finalist. In addition to the Sweepstakes Award, the chapter was recognized for excellence in seven of twelve chapter operation categories.

## Chapter House: Past, Present, and Future Alumni Board Continues Assessment to Determine Next Step

In last summer's newsletter, I provided some background with respect to the Alumni Board's assessment of the future needs for our chapter house. That work is still in the early stages but is progressing. Not surprisingly, I received feedback regarding concerns over the condition of the house. Specifically, there was some feeling that the undergraduates don't take care of what they already have. This is an important issue, and one I want to address head on.

First and foremost, the appearance of the house over the past few years is not acceptable. I, too, am embarrassed and want to see that changed. The reasons, however, are more complicated than the character of the undergraduates. In fact, if there is blame to assess, then put that on me. After all, I took on the role of landlord about 12 years ago. The buck stops with me.

As a volunteer leader of the organization, my first priority is the health and safety of the undergraduates. That involves basic facility inspections and lots of education—not just facility related, but other issues, as well. I could not look a parent in the eye if this was not the top priority.

The second priority has been our programming. For the Fraternity to exist, it must remain a relevant and value-added organization. A lot of our programming was outdated. "Old-school" practices have gotten ATΩ, ΣΧ, Lambda Chi, FIJI, ΣΑΕ and others kicked off campus. We have made great progress in this area and have been recognized by the International Fraternity and Office of Greek Life at Mizzou. I suspect for the average alumnus, however, that progress is under the radar. I have asked the undergraduates to commit to responsible programming in order to make alumni, parents, the University, and the community proud, and they have done that. I've told them that if we have a good product to sell, then the bricks and mortar will follow.

That brings us to the facility itself. We haven't gotten to it as soon as I would have liked. Part of the problem is that the house is just old. It was built 50 years ago for \$100,000! It was done cheaply and no amount of repair work will fix that. Regarding day-to-day maintenance, our outdated model of having new members do all the work, at all hours, is a recipe for probation and worse. It's just the way of today's world.


### Giving Back and Ringing In the Holiday Season

We look forward to the year ahead and know we would not be where we are today without the support of our dedicated alumni. Thank you!





**Q: Where do you work now and what do you do specifically?**


**A:** I work in marketing for Nestle Purina Pet Care.


