Missouri Chapter Wins Third Sweepstakes Award in Five Years

For the second year in a row and the third time in the last five years, Missouri Chapter received the Sweepstakes Award at the DU International Leadership Institute, held July 22-25 in New Orleans, Louisiana. The award is given to the top overall DU chapter in the U.S. and Canada. Qualifications include the chapter's performance in scholarship, leadership, service, and brotherhood. There are currently 82 active DU chapters in North America, with more than 3,500 undergraduate members. Eight undergraduates and two advisors from Missouri were a part of the nearly 400 members in attendance from all over North America.



Missouri Chapter won the Sweepstakes Award for the second consecutive year at the DU International Leadership Institute.

This latest recognition builds on the chapter's Excellence Cup Award last April, given by Mizzou Greek Life to the top overall chapter on the University of Missouri campus. It was the second time in the past five years the chapter had earned that honor.

The Sweepstakes Award was not all that took place over the four days of the convention. On Friday, July 23, more than 350 undergraduates and volunteers from Delta Upsilon, including the eight from the Missouri Chapter, worked with Beacon of Hope to help the

rebuilding efforts of New Orleans after Hurricane Katrina. Delta Upsilon brothers removed overgrown grass and brush from vacant lots in the Lower Ninth Ward. Their work helped clear nearly 10 lots in the area.

DU Helped Alumnus Establish Lifelong Friendships

John Ehrlich '67 Gives Back to Pay It Forward

More than 4,300 miles away in London, England, John Ehrlich '67 missed out on fraternity recruitment his senior year of high school. Hailing from Kansas City, Missouri, he was no stranger to Tiger pride, but he stepped onto Mizzou's campus in 1963 with no plans of going Greek. With a Delta Upsilon pledge for a roommate, however, he witnessed a brotherhood that he wanted in on.

"I met his buddies, and they were just great guys. I loved the camaraderie; there were no cliques in a group of 70 guys. They all had the same mold, the same personalities."

John encountered that same phenomenon 20 years later on a larger scale. Asked to serve as Missouri Chapter's alumnus representative, he had the opportunity to meet alumni from DU chapters across the nation at a luncheon in New York. "It was bizarre how similar we all were. We all had the same humor, the same great undergraduate experiences. It was a great experience to meet 80 other brothers."

Perhaps those similarities are what cultivated the lasting bond John retains from his active Duck days. Despite the distance between them, he keeps in close contact with many of his brothers, often traveling from his Wayne, New Jersey, home to meet them in St. Louis. "They're lifelong friendships we have developed over the years."

Making the trek to Missouri to reunite with his brothers is nothing new to John. He logged 30 years' worth of miles as an American Airlines pilot following a five-year tour of duty for the U.S. Air Force after graduation.

"I'm a big believer in giving back to an experience that helped you get along in life. The Fraternity was very special to me."

"Back then, all freshmen and sophomores had to volunteer for the ROTC. A family friend was the instructor for the Air Force, so that's what I did. I thought it was a pretty good deal, so I applied for the advanced ROTC my junior year. I was a second lieutenant when I graduated."

John's success in the disciplined military environment was partly due to the qualities he gained through the Fraternity. "We learned social interaction, responsibility, and accountability. I was house manager my senior year, so I got to pick up the house every Sunday morning." In between ROTC drills and cleanup duty, John did manage to make a little time for fun. "I have so many great memories, but nothing beats football Saturdays. I still have season tickets."

John earned both his bachelor's and master's degrees in education, but he points toward his long-lasting pilot career as evidence of the endless opportunities available to collegians. "Keep your options open. Having a degree in one specific area doesn't mean you're limited to that specialty. Sooner or later, something will hit your fancy. That's what's great about a big university like MU. There is such variety."

These days, John still travels frequently, but he's content to leave the cockpit controls in someone else's hands. He and his wife, Ann, visit their daughter in Paris and make daytrips to see their other daughter, son, and grandchildren, who live in closer range along the East Coast. And, of course, he continues his longtime support of Missouri Chapter. Mid-October found John back at his old DU stomping grounds, checking out the house and visiting with past and present Ducks. "I'm a big believer in giving back to an experience that helped you get along in life. The Fraternity was very special to me."
