Greek Week

Delta Upsilon and its sorority partner, Chi Omega, placed second overall in this year's Greek Week competition. Fourteen groupings of MU sororities and fraternities, each totaling roughly 400 members, were matched and participated in this year's event. Greek Week is the single largest event of the Greek community at the University of Missouri. Teams participate in seven areas—blood drive, fling, games, public relations, service, special events and beneficiaries—for the purpose of raising money for local charities. This year's event raised nearly \$140,000 for 14 local charities. In addition, more than 1,700 units of blood were donated.



Spotlight on Wayne Black '59



“There are a lot of wonderful young men coming up through the system today. They need the support from alumni so that they can hopefully enjoy even more successes than we have.”

My father said I could go to college anywhere I wanted—anywhere I wanted in the state of Missouri.” That’s how **Wayne Black '59** ended up in Columbia, paying \$82.50 per semester in tuition. In hindsight, he wouldn’t have it any other way. “I joined Delta Upsilon because it seemed like a really good group of fellows,” he says. “The relationships I developed with the brothers, learning to give and take, to negotiate and plan and execute were meaningful experiences.”

Some of Wayne’s favorite memories consist of his Missouri Chapter comrades. “The companionship around the dinner table, playing bridge, and shooting pool with my brothers are still fond memories,” he reflects. “We had an outstanding chorus that was quite good, also. The Greeks had an annual variety show, Savitar Frolics, in which the DUs participated. It was quite a production, particularly for college-age performers.”

In addition to gracing the choir with his musical talents, Wayne served as chapter president in his senior year. “The Fraternity provided a wonderful leadership opportunity,” he says. “It wasn’t doing all the conferences and seminars then that it does today, but we had guidance from a national representative. We always had very sound guidance.”

Upon graduation, Wayne relocated to Washington, D.C., to attend law school at George Washington University. He later joined the Keller and Heckman law firm, where he would work for more than 40 years before retiring in 2008. “I was the sixth attorney in the firm,

and it was just in D.C. when I came,” he says. “Now the firm has offices in San Francisco, Brussels, and Shanghai. I got to participate in the growth and development of that.”

While his professional success can be attributed to intelligence, tenacity, and hard work, Wayne notes that the social expertise he acquired during his years at 200 College Avenue, the former house location, was instrumental in shaping his future. “All the people skills I developed in my college years came in handy,” he says. “There are a lot of wonderful young men coming up through the system today. They need the support from alumni so that they can hopefully enjoy even more successes than we have.”

Just as enduring as the lessons learned through his Delta Upsilon membership are the friendships Wayne established there. Every month, he and a handful of Missouri Chapter alumni from the late 1950s, and even “a couple of young whippersnappers from the class of ’61,” gather to catch up and reminisce on days gone by. “We sit around rooting for the Tigers and picking on the Jayhawks,” Wayne says.

When he’s not dining with his Fraternity brothers, Wayne enjoys relaxing with his wife, Ilze, at their vacation home on the Delaware shore. Although a bone marrow transplant in December has sidelined him temporarily from his usual Ironman triathlon training, he’s looking forward to being back on the bike soon.
