## Missouri Chapter Continues Path of Excellence

### Alumni Host Leadership Retreat for Undergraduates

In January, Delta Upsilon International Fraternity (DUIF) hosted the Winter Educational Conference in Indianapolis. **Chuck Hatley '80** and **J.C. Emerson '62** attended the Alumni Advisor's Conference, and I attended the President's Academy. Later in January, Chuck, J.C. and **Steve Mermelstein '92** organized a leadership retreat for the executive board at the Lake of the Ozarks.

Soon after in March, Chuck, J.C., and Steve accompanied the undergraduate officers to DUIF's Regional Leadership Conference in Kansas City. More than 50 brothers from Province 10 (Kansas, Kansas State, Missouri, Oklahoma, Nebraska and Wichita) were in attendance.

An orientation was held on January 21 for our 10 new associate members and their parents. The meeting allowed parents to meet the undergraduates and alumni, as well as to learn about the operations of the fraternity. During the meeting, **Andrew Riga '14** was awarded the eighth annual Farmer Academic Scholarship. The award was established in memory of **Randal J. Farmer '79**, who passed away in 2003. The award is presented to the new associate member with the highest

fall semester G.P.A. Chapter Advisor **Chuck Hatley '80** was on hand to present the award to Andrew. Randal's parents, Shirley and Jay Farmer, and their granddaughters were also in attendance and assisted with the presentation.

Also in January, the entire outgoing and incoming executive teams were honored at a formal din-

ner at the chapter house. Julie Drury of Greek Life was in attendance and participated in the ceremony.

Second semester initiation was held on April 22. Ten new members were welcomed into membership. They joined 26 new members who were initiated in November. After the initiation ceremony, the chapter held our third annual senior recognition luncheon. Graduating seniors joined the executive board members and

several alumni for a luncheon, renewal of initiation vows, and were welcomed into the alumni association.

Delta Upsilon and our sorority partner, Alpha Delta Pi, placed fourth overall in this year's Greek Week competition. Thirteen groupings of MU sororities and fraternities, each totaling roughly 400 members, were matched and participated in this year's event. Greek Week is the single largest event of the Greek community at the University of Missouri. Teams participate in seven areas for the purpose of raising money for local charities. Activities include the blood drive, fling, games, public relations, service, special events, and beneficiaries. This year's event raised nearly \$130,000 for 13 local charities. Over 1,500 units of blood and 25,000 pounds of food were donated.

Several activities were held during the semester to raise money in support of DUIF's Global Services Initiative. This program allows DU undergraduates from around the nation to travel to Jamaica and provide service to local residents.

## CAREER TALES OF CONGRESSMAN BILLY LONG '77

**C**ongressman **Billy Long '77** always had an interest in politics, helping and supporting various campaigns throughout his life, but he didn't opt for it as a career path right away.

Following his time at Delta Upsilon, Billy began a career in real estate, which led him to the auction industry. After attending auction school in Kansas City, he formed Billy Long Auctions LLC in Springfield, Missouri, and acquired many notable tales.

When he assisted with the Lucille Ball auction in Burbank, California, Billy found *Life* magazines from the 1960s rolled up inside Lucy's knee-high boots. The magazines, he remembers, were addressed to Gary Morton and sold for \$150 each. Also included in the famed actress' estate were vials of henna, the dye she used to color her hair.

Another memorable auction for Billy occurred in 1989, when he sold a Tiffany's sterling silver punch bowl. "We sold the piece for \$99,000 and it didn't even have punch in it," laughs Billy.

Much of Billy's auction fame came from his radio advertisements where he'd do his own voiceovers. "I remember being at a gas station where the attendant recognized my voice, saying he'd heard my commercial a few weeks ago," he recalls. "But, at that point, the commercials hadn't aired for two years. That was when it resonated with me, the power that radio has."

Putting his voice to work, Billy accepted a temporary talk-show post with the Springfield station, KWTO. The assignment turned into a six-year stint. "I tried to have humor like Paul Harvey and cover politics like Rush Limbaugh," he says. "Like the saying goes, you catch more flies with honey than vinegar."

In November 2010, Billy was elected as the U.S. representative for Missouri's 7th congressional district. Now, in office, he compares Washington to DU. "People say that Congress is a lot like a fraternity and it's true. There are people of different backgrounds, lots of politics, freshmen, and upperclassmen," he says. "The Fraternity taught me how to work with people from different areas and provided me a well-rounded education. It prepared me well for life."




