



Brothers Encouraged to Step Up to the Challenge

Steve Balsamo '71—Why I Gave

It was 1967 and quarterback **Bernard "Biff" Ramey '69** was leading DU's intramural football squad while **Steve Balsamo '71** was refining his speed and agility as the freshman wide receiver. The evening before their first big game, Biff and Steve entered into a bet—if Steve caught five touchdown passes during the game, pledge and active roles would be reversed for the following week. At the end of the third quarter, Steve was on fire, having scored four touchdowns, but needless to say did not see another pass thrown his way for the rest of the game.

Steve recalls this and countless other memories with Missouri Chapter brothers as some of his all-time best moments at Mizzou. "Each one of us had our own unique college and DU experience. Mine was overwhelmingly positive and made the decision to contribute to the campaign easy."

Steve encourages brothers to stop and ask themselves, Is it time to give back? For him, supporting and rebuilding the organization that gave him so much was obvious. "The leadership opportunities that my membership in DU afforded me were of considerable importance in preparing me for life beyond college. Serving as house manager, co-rush chairman, and chapter vice president not only padded my resume, but also helped me to develop organizational and teamwork skills. I think I developed not only

these skills but also personal values that would serve me well throughout my life," he says.

In order for the Delta Upsilon legacy to provide similar opportunities for generations to come, it's imperative that alumni step up to the challenge. "A new chapter house is critical to the future of Delta Upsilon at the University of Missouri. The DU chapter at Mizzou has been among the top fraternities and has a lot to offer, but the housing situation had become so grave that our chapter was becoming uncompetitive for this reason alone," he says. "The chapter house fundraising campaign is already a great success, but additional contributions will help reduce the financing costs and make the chapter even stronger."

While Steve's support of DU is palpable, he says Missouri Chapter owes its success to three unsung role models and heroes in particular. "I want to pay tribute to those brothers who have stayed involved and would single out **Terry Brady '62**, **Ted Murray '71**, and **Bruce McKinney '74**. All three have worked tirelessly on behalf of the Missouri Chapter for decades and are still active today and in the forefront of the new chapter house

effort. Our chapter owes a debt of gratitude—and possibly its continued existence—to these brothers and others like them who have stayed involved for a lifetime."



After 30+ years working in the financial services industry, half of which was spent living and traveling between Chicago, New York, Frankfurt, Amsterdam, and London, Steve says the highlight of his career was in its final chapter. For several years before retiring, Steve worked as the CFO for Spear, Leeds and Kellogg (SLK) in New York.

Steve and his wife of 42 years, Susan, met at a DU-ADPi exchange. "She was chosen as DU Angel when we were seniors, which only confirmed my decision to marry her." Steve and Susan tied the knot in the student union chapel the day after they graduated in 1971 and have enjoyed a lifetime of traveling and fostering new hobbies ever since. Steve takes pride in being a family man and spends as much time as possible with his two daughters, Kate (40) and Lindsay (35), and two grandsons, Julian and Wesley.

Chapter Reorganization

The Delta Upsilon International Fraternity (DU) reorganization committee was in Columbia the week of January 26 to kick off implementation of the redevelopment plan. Activities began with a weekend retreat facilitated by DU staff and attended by all chapter members. The chapter developed a core covenant statement and established a list of seven programming priorities. Committees were formed around these priorities and goals/timelines were established for each.

Leadership Programming

DU hosts a President's Academy each year for new chapter presidents. The program provides leadership development and skills training to prepare presidents to effectively run a DU chapter/colony. I was honored to attend this year's session which was held January 8-11 in Indianapolis. The undergraduate executive team, along with alumni board member **Terry Brady '62**, attended DU's Regional Leadership Academy in Kansas City, February 13-15. This academy is a unique opportunity for chapter officers in a specific geographic region to attend sessions that span a wide range of topics affecting fraternity life today. It is designed as an officer training platform to provide tangible skills needed for success.

Spring Recruitment Yields 17 New Brothers

Recruitment for the spring new member class was a success. Seventeen new associate members participated in the pinning ceremony that was held March 9. These new members will be eligible to live in the new house next fall along with all other active members. Our model going forward will be to have all freshmen live in the dorms.

DU Wins 2015 Greek Week Competition!

Greek Week is a three-week period in April where Greek students participate in programs and events that celebrate the values of the office of Greek life and promote a fun environment, highlighting the talents and dedication of the Greek community to both Columbia and the University of Missouri. Greek Week benefits local and national organizations that are in need of funding. Last year, Greek Week raised over \$70,000 for a variety of worthy beneficiaries. This year, the chapter was paired with Kappa Kappa Gamma and FIJI for the 2015 events. **Trevor DeHart '15** served as co-director of the event, and **Brian Hinck '16** and **Quinten Campbell '16** served as members of the steering committee.





ALUMNI UPDATE

CHAPTER ETERNAL



Walter H. "Gus" Harwell '51 entered Chapter Eternal on March 6 in Port Orange, Fla., at the age of 85. Gus was a native of Tupelo, Miss., and began his journalism career as business manager and reporter for his high school

newspaper. He graduated from the University of Missouri's top-ranked school of journalism and spent seven years working for newspapers in his native Mississippi before Knight-Ridder hired him in 1962. He spent several years as publisher of Knight-Ridder's *Boca Raton News* before moving to Tallahassee. Gus was a Tallahassee Democrat publisher from 1973 to 1981, becoming the first person to hold the title of publisher in the corporate era. Throughout his time Gus achieved several personal and career accomplishments, leaving an impact on each and every person he came in contact with. Gus' kindness was contagious, and it extended to the student newspapers at Florida State University and Florida A&M University. Gus is remembered as a warm-hearted newsman and mentor. He and his wife, Mary Ann, were married for 62 years before her death in February 2014. They had a son who died during the 1970s and one daughter, Suzanne.


