DELTA UPSILON NAMED TOP CHAPTER AT UNIVERSITY OF MISSOURI

- Record of Achievement Continues
- 2009 Annual Contributions Exceed \$15,000

The University of Missouri's Annual Greek Honors Night was held at Memorial Union on April 27, 2010. The Missouri Chapter of Delta Upsilon won two of the top five awards, including the Excellence Cup (top overall performance) and the President's Cup (leadership). The chapter was runner-up in the Columbia Cup (service & philanthropy), and members received a number of individual awards.

This latest honor builds upon the chapter's recent string of success, which includes the 2006 University of Missouri Excellence Cup award. The chapter was also named the Sweepstakes award winner as the top chapter in North America by Delta Upsilon International Fraternity in 2006 and 2009.

Greek Honors Night recognizes individual chapters on the Missouri campus for exempli-

fying the Greek community's founding principles of scholarship, leadership, service and brotherhood/sisterhood. Nominations are reviewed and judged by a panel consisting of representatives from the University's faculty and staff. This year's keynote speaker was Vice Chancellor of Student Affairs Cathy Scroggs. She stated how lucky we are to have a world-class Greek system at the University of Missouri. The night concluded with Delta Upsilon taking home six total awards.

The Excellence Cup (Overall Performance)
This award is given to the chapter that exhibits the best overall combination of scholarship, service and philanthropy, leadership, and programming.

The President's Cup (Leadership)
This award is given to the chapter that excels in leadership throughout the Greek community.

Brothers, look at all the good things going on in the chapter and at the University—I hope you share in my feeling of pride as an alumnus of both institutions.



FOUNDER'S DAY CELEBRATION AND INITIATION CEREMONY SUCCESSFUL

The 85th anniversary of the Missouri Chapter was also celebrated. Highlighting this segment of the ceremony was the presentation of the Founder's Medal to **Terry Brady '62**. The medal is the highest honor that the International Fraternity can bestow upon a DU alumnus for volunteer service to an individual chapter. Fifteen of Terry's closest brothers from the 1960s and early 1970s were in attendance to share in the celebration.

Terry was rush chairman and president while an undergraduate. Most notably, however, Terry served as alumni president for nearly 20 years! He also served on the international board for six years. Beyond the Fraternity, Terry has distinguished himself in his professional and personal life. After graduation, Terry went on to law school at Mizzou and joined the law firm of Lathrop & Gage, where he is a partner. In 2005, he was appointed by the governor of Missouri to the board of police commissioners for the city of Kansas City where he now serves as president. Terry is a man of strong faith who is a member of the Catholic Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph, where he serves on the executive committee.

After the formal ceremony, undergraduates, parents, and alumni attended a buffet luncheon at Boone's Tavern restaurant. It was a great ending to a special day and should serve as a model for celebrations in the future.

December 5, 2009, was a special day for the Missouri Chapter of Delta Upsilon.

Twenty-nine new members were welcomed into the Fraternity at a ceremony held at Memorial Union, bringing the number of Missouri alumni to 2,057. **Brandon Terrebone '11** of St. Louis was the undergraduate speaker.
